Covid and Flu Shot Vaccine Clinic

We will be holding a vaccine clinic on Monday November 24th starting at 9:00 AM. We will be spreading out the number of spots and giving time slots to return for the vaccine/flu shot to reduce waiting times. I recommend those that can get the flu shot/Covid Vaccine at their doctor's office/pharmacy, do so to reduce wait times on the day of the clinic.

We will only have two paramedics available to administer the vaccine and flu shot, so please be prepared to wait. Both the Covid Vaccine and Flu shot will be available at the same time.

The conditions for getting the Covid Vaccine include: 3 months since last vaccine, no confirmed case of Covid in the last six months. If you have questions, please call the Supportive Housing Office.

SEPTEMBER BOARD HIGHLIGHTS:

- The Annual General Meeting (AGM) will be held on Friday, November 28th beginning at 9:30 a.m. in the Rec Hall
- The Board is in the process of making changes to the by-laws. These changes will be approved by the Board and presented at the AGM for a vote.
- The Board established a Nomination Committee to replace open seats on the Board of Directors. The committee's recommended slate of candidates will be presented at the AGM for approval.

AGM Details:

Two open positions (for non-residents) have been approved by the Board and will be inducted at the AGM. There will be representatives of the Branch 133 Legion and representatives for Branch 133 Legion Village Residents. Please come out to vote to approve the new Members for the 2025-2026 Branch 133 Legion Village Inc. Board of Directors.

To participate in the annual general meeting, held Friday November 28th at 9:30 a.m.:

Please arrive between 0900 – 0915, with your Legion Membership if you are a Member of the Branch 133 Cobourg Legion. We will take roll call at the beginning of the meeting, so we know who is in attendance.

MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT REQUEST:

Jake and the Managers will be conducting a full evacuation of the building for Fire Safety purposes in November. This fire evacuation is intended to practice our Fire Plan that is

updated annually. We will be sounding internal and external alarms. We will be sending a notification of the instructions in advance of the evacuation, which is tentatively set for November 18th 2025.

Snow removal protocols will be sent out again this year in November. If you park at Legion Village, please make yourself aware of the policy, and be prepared to move your vehicle if there has been a snowfall greater than 5 cm. You will be notified to move your vehicle to a safe alternative spot. Again, we remind you to be cognizant of local parking laws. Legion Village will not be responsible for parking tickets and/or other fees associated with vehicles off site. Once again, this year we have been granted permission to park at the Cobourg Legion as the snow is removed from our parking lot. If you are going to be away in the winter months, please let the office know who you have assigned to move your vehicle in your absence.

Visitors and Deliveries:

If you have a visitor between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m we will be able to screen the visitors and allow entry for deliveries. After these hours, we ask that you have your visitors and/or deliveries punch in your code on the panel in the front vestibule. We are in the process of updating the system, and if your number currently isn't working, and you have notified the office already, please have your guest/delivery person punch in code 9876 and the staff will allow entry. If you receive a call from the panel to allow your visitor, you can press 9 to allow them entry.

Overnight Guests:

Many of you have enquired about having overnight guests. As long as we are not in outbreak and you are not self-isolating or feeling unwell, overnight guests are welcome. Your guest must sign in and be screened at the front desk. All visitors must always enter through the front doors only and be screened in at the front desk.

Unwanted Visitors:

Recently, we have had a number of calls to the front desk to report suspicious visitors on both Legion Village property and in the empty soccer fields and/or bus stop. Please be advised that there are family members of our residents that like to walk the grounds and some smoke/vape outside, as Legion Village is a smoke-free environment. Also, be aware that we can not do anything about visitors on both the soccer fields and/or in the bus stop. These areas are public property and anyone is allowed to be there. If you see someone using illicit drugs (visible

paraphernalia) you may call the police, or ask the front desk to get someone to investigate during business hours.

We have several video recording cameras in the parking lots and at entrances to the building, so we can investigate any unwanted visitors on Legion Village property. Please remember not to allow anyone in the building you do not know either by buzzing them in, or allowing them to follow you into the building. All staff have been issued ID cards with their names and pictures on them to help residents identify those walking around in or out of Legion Village.

DIETARY DEPARTMENT UPDATE

Thanksgiving was a great celebration on Saturday October 11th in the dining room. It was nice to see so many extra faces, giving us many things to be Thankful for! The dietary staff put together a great meal.

There is a Food Committee Meeting in the Rec Hall on Thursday, November 13th at 2PM.

Please note that when you wish to be added to the dining room list for meals, we try to accommodate seating requests as best as we can. We can not guarantee all requests for 3 or 4 at a table, as our dining room is quite full (especially for Sunday dinner or special event meals). We appreciate your co-operation when your request can not be accommodated. Booking your request ahead of time increases your chance to be accommodated, as all bookings are on a first-in model.

Christmas Dinner in the Dining Room

We will be offering a few spaces for residents that normally do not join us in the dining room to purchase a Christmas Dinner in the dining room on December 25th 2025. If you have decided to stay home this year, or you wish to invite a guest, you can join us in the dining room for a turkey meal with all the trimmings and a glass of wine at a cost of \$20.00 per guest. Due to capacity, we may not be able to accommodate everyone and will therefore be creating a waiting list. If space allows, we will add guests to the waiting list but remember that residents will take priority over guests.

Please let Tammy know if you would like to be added to the list. We are placing a cut off date of December 12th. If you are from Phase 2/3 or are already a regular in our dining room, you are already included and do not need to call for a reservation, unless it is to inform us that you will not be attending. If you know you are going to be elsewhere for dinner on Christmas, please let us know by the December 12th deadline.
